UNIFORM POLICY

The school's uniform policy has been agreed upon, and is supported by, the school's Parents and Citizens Association.

The pupils of this school are recognised by the uniform they wear. Apart from being more practical and more economical than supplying miscellaneous clothing, the uniform serves several purposes. These include the establishment of a sense of belonging, the development of school pride, the maintenance of school tone, the feeling of pride in themselves and the meeting of Department of School Education safety requirements in regard to footwear. The uniform also provides for student safety in the playground, in that students are easily recognised as being members of the school.

On Tuesday 16 November the Formal Sports Assembly was held to recognise and celebrate the sporting achievements of Ingleburn High School students in the areas of Sports Carnivals, Grade Sport, Premier Sporting Challenge and Junior Sport. The PDHPE faculty is proud of the 2010 award recipients and commend them for the manner in which they conducted themselves while representing Ingleburn High in their respective sports. The 'Grade Sport Best and Fairest' awards were the first presented as they recognise not only athletic ability, but also sportsmanship. These students understand that athletes should not only seek excellence in performance but also in attitude. A special mention to Corey O'Meley who achieved Best and Fairest in both the Summer (Softball) and Winter (Touch Football) competitions.

In 2010 more than 40 students competed in the 'NSW Premier Sporting Challenge'. This challenge is a Government initiative that aims to engage young people in sport and physical activity and encourage them to lead healthy and active lifestyles. Alex Graham, the Premier Sporting Challenge Ambassador's Co-ordinator presented an Award of Congratulations to the students and school for participating. A special mention must go to Mrs Holden for coordinating the challenge at Ingleburn High School.

The school was privileged to have Dani Samuels, an Australian sporting hero, attend the Assembly. Dani Samuels became the youngest World Champion discus thrower of all time winning the World Championships in Berlin with a throw of 65.44 metres. Unfortunately Dani withdrew from the Australian Commonwealth Games team at this year's Commonwealth Games in New Delhi, India due to health issues, however she is gunning for the 2012 Olympic Games in London. Dani Samuels was interviewed by Mr Elbahou (Head Teacher – PDHPE) on the assembly and inspired the audience by sharing her story of determination in sport. It was a great honour for the 2010 Athletics Age Champions to meet with Dani. The PDHPE faculty would like to extend a big thank you to the twelve members of Ingleburn High School's teaching staff who volunteered their time and effort to coach many of the Knockout and Grade Sport teams this year. Without their support in sport, our students would not be given the enriching experiences they have received this year and the opportunity to enjoy the benefits of sport and physical activity. A special mentioned to Mr Kelly, the winner of the Coach of the Year award!

Each year we seek to acknowledge Excellence in Sport by awarding a Grade, Junior and Senior Sports Person of the Year award. A special congratulation to Ryan Capps (Grade Sport Person of the Year). Taylor Dunn (Junior Sport Person of the Year) and Ashleigh Bootsma (Senior Sport Person of the Year).

Water polo player's making waves

TEENAGE water polo player **Samantha Stanton** won a silver medal in the national water polo championships in Brisbane on Monday.

The 13-year-old was recently selected for the NSW under-14 water polo team.

Unbeaten in seven of their eight games, the NSW team lost 5-4 to Queensland in extra time in the final.

Samantha missed two games, including the final, due to a bout of the flu.

A member of Macquarie Fields swimming squad, Samantha has been playing water polo since the age of eight.

The Ingleburn High School student was selected as one of 40 girls in the NSW training squad following the club championships in Tamworth where she played for Drummoyne.

Following a week-long camp at Narrabeen for intensive training, Samantha was selected in the NSW Blues' team of 13.

A representative for Sydney South West Schools' water polo team, Samantha will also compete in Tamworth in November for the Combined High Schools NSW titles.

A love of water polo runs in the family as brother Jake is a NSW representative.

Samantha's mother Wendy a water polo coach believes Macarthur could produce more talented players if the area improved facilities.

"It is a shame that the Campbelltown area does not have the facilities to accommodate such a growing sport as water polo," she said.

``There is a saying `build it and they will come'.

``Campbelltown has such a depth of great young swimmers who would make great water polo players. But we do not have outdoor heated swimming pools deep enough to accommodate the sport.

``You only have to go to Sutherland Pool on a Friday night in the middle of winter and you have nearly 200 players.

``To build a utility pool that can be used for many things is the smart way to go, instead of refurbishing old pools that can only be used for lap swimming."
