National and Regional Awards

During Term 4 we have received National and Regional recognition for excellence and innovation for three separate school programs.

At the Director's Choice Regional Award evening we received the **Regional Award for School Excellence** for our Middle School Transition programs with our feeder primary schools. This award recognises the significant partnerships and links which we have established with our community primary schools – Sackville Street, Ingleburn and Ingleburn North – in recent years. It is the second time in the last four years that the school has been recognised in this way. I would like to thank the transition teams in all four schools for their professionalism, dedication and support. This Award is formal recognition for all the work that these teams do each year.

The school has also received a National Award from the Beacon Foundation along with Ashcroft, Nepean and Plumpton High Schools for being the Most Outstanding School Cluster in Australia. 2012 is the first year that we have established links with the Beacon Foundation. The Foundation sponsors and runs innovative welfare programs which seek to engage local business connections for our Year 10 students. The ultimate aim is to ensure that all of our students commit to a path of further education, training or employment at the conclusion of their time at school. I would like to thank and acknowledge the Blackrock Finance Company as our main corporate sponsor during 2012 and also Ms Jane Artup, the State Manager of the Beacon Foundation, for their support and guidance.

The Pacific Island students also received Regional recognition for their culturally based Creative Arts performances during the year. The award was for **Most Outstanding Achievement in the Region**. Parent, Mr Tim Time, deserves recognition for all his work with our students that resulted in this award.

"Put the spray away so we can all breathe a little easier"

School settings, such as change

rooms and classrooms, can be environments where high concentrations of aerosol deodorants, body sprays and hair sprays are used. Many people with asthma find that these types of products can exacerbate their asthma, causing symptoms that make it harder for them to breathe. In Australia one in ten children has asthma, but young people spraying aerosols may not realise that they could be affecting other people near them with asthma.

It is school policy that aerosol deodorants not be used in school. A better option is the roll-on deodorants.

This a further reminder to all asthma sufferers to keep their inhaler close by at all times.

ANTI-RACISM – A MESSAGE FROM THE ARCO



Ingleburn High School has a strong

commitment to Multicultural Education, Equity and Equality. These beliefs permeate all of our school policies including our Anti-Racism Policy, the Cultural Diversity and Community Relations Policy, Multicultural Education in Schools, the Aboriginal Education and Training Policy and the Complaints Handling Policy, amongst others. This ethos is embedded in our teaching practice and not only is it taught explicitly to students, but it also forms part of our expectations of the safe, respectful learners that attend Ingleburn High School.

Any member of the school community has the right to lodge a complaint and seek a favourable resolution if they have been the victim of racial vilification in the school context. The resolution of such complaints can be either formal or informal depending on the severity and frequency of the abuse. It is my duty as an Anti-Racism Contact Officer (ARCO) of Ingleburn High School to handle such complaints and to provide mediation, education and monitoring that leads to reduced recidivism of racial abuse in our school.

If any student experiences such vilification, they are encouraged to speak to their teacher and to see myself in the History, Languages and Music Faculty in B17. If you have any questions regarding our policies or the resolution process, please contact me through the school's front office.
