Hello to the Ingleburn High School Community

## Boys 180 Degrees – Turn Your Life Around Program

Recently a number of boys participated in an intense social skills program designed at teaching boys how to deal with various situations in life. The program covered areas such as anger management, better decision making skills, team work, social inclusion, masculinity and homophobia.

Students also underwent a full days training on field craft skills, which taught students how to put up a tent, cook outdoors, read maps and compasses as well as outdoor first aid.

All students who completed the course were then invited to attend a two day overnight camp inside the Bents Basin National Park. Once we arrived students were required to set up tent and then followed a range of activities including team work skills, team bonding, swimming and a six kilometre full backpack hike. Also during the evening all the boys were individually interviewed and counselled about turning their lives around. After a game of hide and seek at 10.00pm, we sat around a bonfire and discussed a range of personal issues and offered each other support.

The boys were well behaved and the program was a great success. Two of these boys will be invited to be part of the program in 2014 as 180 mentors.

## ANTI-RACISM – A MESSAGE FROM THE ARCO



Ingleburn High School has a strong commitment to Multicultural Education, equity and equality. These beliefs permeate all of our school policies including our Anti-Racism Policy, the Cultural Diversity and Community Relations Policy, Multicultural Education in schools, the Aboriginal Education and Training Policy and the Complaints Handling Policy, amongst others. This ethos is embedded in our teaching practice and not only is it taught explicitly to students, but it also forms part of our expectations of the safe, respectful learners that attend Ingleburn High School.

Any member of the school community has the right to lodge a complaint and seek a favourable resolution if they have been the victim of racial vilification in the school context. The resolution of such complaints can be either formal or informal depending on the severity and frequency of the abuse. It is my duty as an Anti-Racism Contact Officer (ARCO) of Ingleburn High School to handle such complaints and to provide mediation, education and monitoring that leads to reduced recidivism of racial abuse in our school.

If any student experiences such vilification, they are encouraged to speak to their teacher and to see myself in the History, Languages and Music Faculty in B17. If you have any questions regarding our policies or the resolution process, please contact me through the school's front office.

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
